

Greek Privileges

All chapters recognized and in good standing with the university are granted the following university privileges:

1. use of Georgia State University facilities, equipment, and services, subject to university policies and procedures;
2. the right to self-governance, through the established policies and procedures of the governing councils and within the parameters of university policies (inclusive to voting rights and attendance in membership intake or programming events);
3. access to information about the academic achievement of chapter members, subject to university policy regarding authorized release of student information;
4. verification of chapter members' Georgia State University enrollment, subject to university policy regarding authorized release of student information;
5. participation in the Five Star program and university advisement in enhancing the chapter in the areas of academics, citizenship, campus involvement, chapter development and membership development;
6. inclusion in university and student publications;
7. ability to have a website hosting information regarding the chapter;
8. eligibility for awards and honors presented to Georgia State University organizations and their members;
9. permission to collect reasonable dues, sponsor fund-raising events, and solicit funds, subject to university policy;
10. participation in or host of designated athletic, cultural, social, and other group events, including programs sponsored by its councils, Greek and other chartered student organizations, university departments, or the Greek Life Advisor in the Office of Student Life and Leadership;
11. permission to sponsor programs and activities consistent with the broader aims of the university and with the purposes of their organization;
12. eligibility to rent and occupy a Greek organization room in the Student*University Center;
13. the right to utilize bulletin board space for the organization on the fourth floor of the Student Center;
14. the use of a student organization mailbox in the Office of Student Life and Leadership;
15. the right to recruit and select members subject to university policies as provided for in section 86.14, Title IX, U.S. Education Act of 1972;
16. the right to engage new members in a membership education process resulting in membership to the respective fraternity or sorority;
17. the right to utilize Georgia State University's name on the fraternal organization's national website and publications; and
18. other privileges that may derive from membership in one or more of its councils.
