THE PROGRAM

The Georgia State University Program – Landscapes of Memory: History, Culture and Historic Preservation in Barcelona, Spain, offers an exciting 18-day study abroad experience. The program is designed to deepen the students' understanding of the history of Barcelona and the Catalonia region of Spain, its culture and how the city and region are working to preserve their historic cultural sites, parks and landscapes. The program will consider the ways in which history is selectively remembered, preserved and presented to the public. Students will develop skills in combining and communicating the results of field experiences and research. Visits to historic sites, gardens, parks and landscapes will be interspersed with lectures and discussions led by the instructors and local experts in the field.

In addition to visiting historic and cultural sites in the city, participants will take day trips to cities in the Catalan region. Sites to be visited will include:

- Many of the buildings and parks designed by Antoni Gaudi, including Sagrada Familia, Casa Mila, Casa Batllo and Parc Guell
- Landmarks of the Modernist movement including Hospital de la Santa Creu i de Sant Pau, Palau de la Musica Catalonia and homes along Passeig de Gracia Street
- Barcelona's Gothic Cathedral
- Parks, Squares and Gardens of Barcelona
- Montjuic and the sites of the 1992 Olympics
- Day trip to medieval cities of Girona and Besalu
- Day trip to Roman ruins of Tarragona

The program will be under the direction of Richard Laub, Director of the Heritage Preservation Program in the Department of History and Fernando Reati, Associate Professor of Spanish, Department of Modern and Classical Languages, Georgia State University.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Participants will stay in high quality local accommodations in the city of Barcelona.

ELIGIBILITY

This program is offered to all students at the graduate level. Undergraduates may take the course, with instructor approval, as a Directed Reading.

COURSE CREDIT

Students wishing to receive academic credit will register for HIST 8660, Case Studies in International Preservation, for the Summer 2006 term. All participants will attend an orientation session on April 1, 2006 at Georgia State University. Course credit will be three semester hours.

COST

Program costs may vary according to currency fluctuations and travel arrangements. Fees are tentatively set at \$3,100. Students also pay regular Georgia State University tuition and fees. Scholarships are available to Georgia State students through the Georgia State University IEF Study Abroad Scholarship Program and the Georgia State University Foundation Study Abroad Scholarship. REGISTRATION INFORMATION

The deadline for registration is January 17, 2006. A \$200 non-refundable deposit is due at the time of registration. The balance will be paid in two equal installments due on or before March 3 and April 3 at the mandatory orientation meeting to be held at Georgia State University, non-refundable after those dates.

Upon acceptance to the study abroad program, non-Georgia State University students who would be considered transient/visiting students at Georgia State, if they wish to receive credit for the study abroad course, will be required to provide all of the following:

1. An application for admission to Georgia State University and a non-refundable \$50 application fee. The application form for undergraduate students is available at the following website: <http://www.gsu.edu/~wwwadm/app.html>
2. A letter of good standing and permission to attend from the Registrar's Office at the current/home institution
3. A statement of residency status for tuition purposes from the Registrar's Office of the current/home institution (out-of-state students will pay only an additional \$250 beyond in-state tuition).
