General Description

Provides advanced level support for hardware and operating systems software critical to the university's core information systems.

Examples of Duties

- Leads the designing, implementing, and supporting of critical systems and operational procedures.
- Coordinates the analysis and mapping of the university's core computing infrastructure, architecture, and applications.
- Diagnoses and resolves problems with various operating systems (UNIX, Windows, LINUX, etc) and other hardware problems.
- Installs and configures critical systems according to prescribed standards.
- Applies patches, upgrades, and maintenance to system security.
- Document systems configurations, installations, and maintenance operations.
- Coordinates the training of university staff and consults with customers, clients, and constituencies using university information systems.
- Guides the testing, documentation, and performance of quality assurance on installed, maintained, or upgraded software and hardware.
- Performs other technical duties as assigned.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities

- Knowledge of data processing principles, practices, and equipment.
- Knowledge of large integrated systems and event driven programming.
- Ability to multi-task, train staff, and use independent judgment.
- Knowledge of Windows XP & 2000, programming languages (COBOL, C, C++, Visual Basic, Pearle, Java, relational databases (Oracle), middleware, LANs, UNIX, etc).
- Effective time management, customer service, analytical, and organizational skills.
- Effective oral and verbal communication with external and internal customers.
