RESPONSIBILITY AND LIABILITY

It is mandatory for all Georgia State University students to purchase international medical insurance. Exchange students are expected to purchase this insurance, including the following benefits: Medical Insurance, Emergency Medical Evacuation and Repatriation of Remains. For more information, please contact the program director. Participants who are U.S. citizens must hold a valid U.S. Passport with an expiration date of 6 months beyond the date of return. Participants must obtain their own passports and are required to carry them. International students at Georgia State University who hold F-1 visas must contact the Office of International Student and Scholar Services (404-413-2070) to discuss possible implications of study abroad for their immigration status.

The university reserves the right to alter program arrangements if required by circumstances. Students will be required to sign a Waiver of Liability/ Indemnification form and a Refund Policy Form in order to participate in the exchange program.

THE PROGRAM

Experience Seoul, Korea, one of Asia's most high tech and modern cities. A complex blend of both Western modernism and traditional Eastern culture, Seoul is a city of contrasts that offers many unique experiences.

Through formal agreements with Ewha Womans University and Hanyang University, Georgia State University provides Georgia State University students with the opportunity to spend from one semester to one academic year in Seoul.

Ewha Womans University

Ewha Womans University is the largest women's university in the world and one of the top universities in Korea. Founded in 1886, it is also one of the oldest Korean universities and its sprawling campus grounds are home to over 21,000 students, 14 colleges, 13 graduate schools and 37 research institutes. Ewha's well established international program for undergraduate exchange students attracts students from all over the world. Although it is a woman's university, both men and women are admitted into Ewha International Co-Ed Programs.

Hanyang University

Hanyang University is one of the leading private universities in Korea and is most famous for its strong record in the field of engineering. Comprised of 23 colleges, 15 graduate schools, 2 hospitals and 43 research institutes and 32,000 students, Hanyang has developed an extensive international exchange program and has agreements with universities in 18 countries. It is a high tech campus that offers state of the art libraries and facilities.

Both Ewha and Hanyang offer summer semester programs that Georgia State University students can enroll in on their own. Hanyang's summer program includes an optional trip to China.

REGISTRATION AND APPLICATION INFORMATION

To apply, students should submit the following materials to Kim Reimann (404-413-6183, kreimann@gsu.edu) by March 1 for fall semester programs and October 15 for spring semester programs.

- Completed application (part of this brochure)
- A current resume
- 2 letters of recommendation from instructors familiar with the student's recent work
- A completed recommendation waiver form
- A 500 word essay describing the student's interest in the program and the expected benefits of participating in this exchange program
- Transcript or PACE form

Upon acceptance, students will be required to comply with Georgia State University's Study Abroad Crisis Policy. Each student must submit a Student Data Sheet, and information to complete an Emergency Contact Information Sheet to the program director. Additionally, students must conduct a pre-departure health check and complete the mandatory Health Form.

Students who would like to use financial aid (e.g. HOPE) for this program are requested to go to the Financial Aid Office to complete required paperwork for study abroad. Georgia State University students are also eligible to apply for the following scholarships: IEF Study Abroad Scholarship and Georgia State University Foundation Scholarship. Please contact the Study Abroad Programs Office for further information at 404-413-2529.

Following the review of the applications, finalists may be asked to interview with the program director prior to selection. Upon selection, students chosen for the program will have to fill out additional application forms for each Korean institution.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Both Ewha and Hanyang Universities have on-campus dormitories and offer housing for international students. This is an opportunity to experience university life in Korea and meet other international students from around the world. Dorms are similar to those in the United States, with lounges, a dining hall, laundry facilities and sometimes a small store.

COURSES AND CREDIT

In addition to Korean language instruction, both Ewha and Hanyang offer courses in English in practically every field of study. Asian studies majors are encouraged to take courses related to Asia, but in general students can take other courses depending on their major and their academic interests. Students may apply for credit for the courses they take and earn between 6 to 12 credits per semester. To get credit, students must design a program of courses before leaving for Korea and get approval from the director of the Korea exchange program at Georgia State University.

ELIGIBILITY

The program is open to Georgia State University undergraduate students who have completed at least two years of university work prior to enrollment. Enrollment is limited to up to two students for each university, so applicants are encouraged to apply early for these competitive spots. Students should have a grade point average of at least 3.0. Participation is contingent upon acceptance by the program director. Although some knowledge of Korean is useful, it is not required.

COST

Ewha and Hanyang will waive registration fees and tuition for Georgia State University students enrolled through this program. Program participants, however, must pay their usual fees to Georgia State University for the semester(s) they are in Korea. Students are also responsible for airfare to Seoul, lodging and meal expenses while residing in Korea, and any other personal expenses.
