Whereas the purpose of the Student Government Association is to provide a responsive forum for student opinions and interests and to actively seek out, investigate and resolve student complaints and concerns; and

Whereas the Student Government Association is the official voice of the students; and

Whereas it is in the interests of the University for its students to graduate in a timely manner; and

Whereas the scholastic efforts of the students should be justly rewarded; and

Whereas students currently enrolled in the 1010, 1020, 2010, and 2020 level Military Science Leadership courses do not receive credit hours for their efforts; and

Whereas the students who are enrolled in either of these two courses and are contracted Army ROTC cadets are obliged to undergo a minimum of five and half hours of organized physical training and labs, which are often off campus, each week and conduct recruiting events and multi-day field training exercises over the course of a semester; and

Therefore let it be resolved that the Student Government Association is in favor of lobbying the Georgia State University Senate that students who are enrolled in either the 1010, 1020, 2010, or 2020 Military Science Leadership courses and are also contracted cadets in the Georgia State Army ROTC program should receive the credit hours normally assigned to the classes.
